1. Introduction

Between 2017 and 2018, missio carried out evaluations of four institutes that offer formation in psychospiritual counselling on different levels and for different, but partly overlapping, target groups.

These four institutes were the following:

- Psycho-Spiritual Institute (PSI)
- Embulbul Education and Counselling Centre
- MA Programme in "Psychological Counselling" at the Catholic University of Eastern Africa
- Arusha Mental Health Trust

These evaluations provided a clearer picture of the strengths and weaknesses of different approaches concerning not only the formation but also the care in psycho-spiritual counselling by pastoral staff in Eastern Africa. Overall, the evaluation by the former mentioned institutes provided a highly positive picture on the potential of psycho-spiritual counselling as well as formation.

To share these insights with the African church, a conference was held in Nairobi in October 2019. The underlying intention was to deepen and intensify the awareness of African church personnel in the topic of psycho-spiritual counselling. 52 representatives of Bishop Conferences of congregations that were interested in diving deeper into the topic of psycho-spiritual counselling attended the conference. The conference was a means for learning, knowledge sharing as well as networking.

After the conference, the participants were provided with the different material, as well as minutes and written reports. Further, discussions were held about future collaboration potential. As one of several follow-up measures of the conference, missio has sent a questionnaire to the participants to evaluate the level of implementation of follow-up activities one year after the conference. This questionnaire consists of six parts, from which the first five treat questions concerning personal information, learning outcomes, networking follow-up, follow-up activities as well as supportive and hindering factors of follow-up activity implementation. The last part referred to recommendations concerning both, the issue of strengthening psycho-spiritual counselling in the church context and recommendations to missio. This report is oriented alongside the questions of the missio survey that was mentioned above.



2. Findings

2.1. Personal information

In total, 53 participants of the conference visited the survey's website, from which 45 actively took part in the survey. 39 participants successfully finished the survey, 6 broke off.

The respondents' background is of great diversity: 13,3%¹ come from Uganda, followed by Tanzania and ACWECA (11,1% each) and Nigeria and Zimbabwe (8,9% each). Mostly, the respondents work in leadership positions, such as in the Secretary General Office, in conferences of Bishops or in several institutes. A smaller percentage consists of Bishops, formators, priests and sisters or fathers. 55,6% of the respondents are female.

2.2. Learning outcome

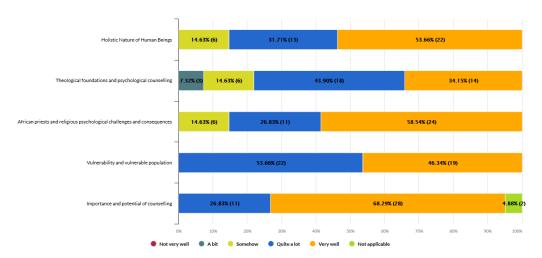


Figure 1: How well do you remember the following issues or insights from the presentations?

In general, the question about how well the respondents remember the conference' contents, draws a positive picture. All five categories ("Holistic Nature of Human Beings", "Theological foundations and psychological counselling", "African priests and religious psychological challenges and consequences", "Vulnerability and vulnerable population", "Importance and potential of counselling") are either well or very well remembered by the respondents. Particularly, all of them (100%) remember well to very well the content of the topic "Vulnerability and vulnerable population". The topic of "Importance and potential of counselling" is remembered well to very well by 95,1% of the respondents, the missing 4,9% assessed the question with "not applicable". Only 7,3% of the respondents do not well remember the content of "Theological foundations and psychological counselling". Overall, the different topics of the conference seem to have positively appealed to the respondents. Figure 1 presents the results graphically.

According to the respondents, the main message taken away from the conference is about the urgent need of psycho-spiritual counselling. This need is twofold: one the one hand, the need for pastoral staff themselves, on the other hand, the need for people living in the communities (families, etc.). The respondents became aware of the fact that church personnel themselves are vulnerable human beings, similar to their clients and thus also need psycho-spiritual counselling.

"The vulnerability of us all. That we are all vulnerable in different ways and we need help through psychological and psycho-spiritual counsellina."

"The awareness of the holistic nature of human beings and the need to pay attention to my/other people's psycho-spiritual needs on time. Awareness of my/other people's vulnerability and seeking appropriate help from the right persons." "The realization that I am a spiritual being in the progress of becoming a person who moves from being a wounded healer to be a healed healer."

A further lessen-learned is the realization that psycho-spiritual counselling should be an indispensable part of pastoral formation.

"Psychological, spiritual and psychosocial counselling are important elements in the formation of young men into priesthood and young women into religious life if we want to be successful and have mature and stable persons in ministry."

"The need for continued sensitization of this issue at initial and ongoing formation."

"The need for the church to prepare well-trained and formed personnel to render some psycho-spiritual accompaniment, assessment and support of candidates to the priesthood and religious life, apart from support of pastoral agents."



2.3. Networking follow-up

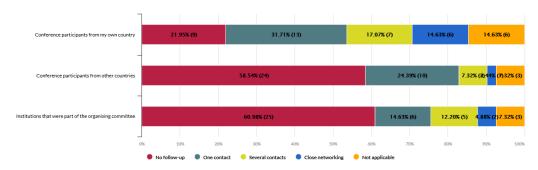


Figure 2: Did you follow-up with any new contacts from the conference to further engage in specific issues?

31,7% of the respondents networked closely or at least had several contacts with conference participants from their home countries. 10% got in closer touch with participants from other countries and 15% with members of institutions of the organizational committees. 24,4% followed up with one foreign contact, 14,6% got in touch with one member of the institutions that were part of the organizational committees. However, 60% of the respondents did not get in touch with neither foreign participants, nor members of the organizational committees. The results are presented in Figure 2.

2.4. Follow-up activities

50% of the respondents have already started to implement 10 out of the following 14 listed activities:

- Compile and re-read the presentations and the material provided
- Feedback of conference to colleagues and leaders
- Sharing insights with Bishop/leadership
- Information dissemination in own institution
- Create awareness in own institution
- Create awareness beyond, e.g. in community
- Advocate for the issue in church or/and society
- Seeking financial resources
- Introduce topic in formation
- Get training to become a counsellor or psycho-spiritual advisor
- Facilitate training opportunities for others
- Build up structures for counselling in own institution
- Develop policies for counselling in own institution
- Lead by example (going for individual or peer counselling)

However, beside the activities of "Compile and re-read the presentations and material provided" and "Create awareness in own institution", between 2,5% and 17,5% of the respondents do not plan to implement any of the listed activities. Thus, it can be assumed that all respondents at least plan to treat



the topic of psycho-spiritual counselling, but not all plan to implement specific activities. 17,5% of the respondents do not plan to seek for financial resources and the same percentage does not aim to implement counselling trainings.

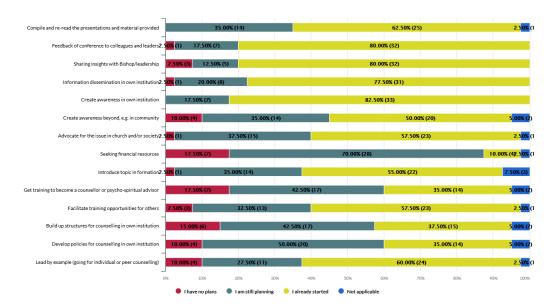


Figure 3: At the end of the conference, all participants have reflected in groups and individually about possible follow-up activities. What of the following have you already realized or do you want to plan to realize?

Although 17,5% do not seek for financial resources, 70% of the respondents plan to do so. 50% plan to elaborate specific policies for psycho-spiritual counselling, followed by 42,5% that plan to build up structures for counselling within their institutions and/or to become a counsellor themselves. The four latter activities show the greatest percentages for planning stage, which could be explained by their long-term orientation, different from, for example, the creation of awareness within an institution. Those activities that are mostly of short-term exercises ("Feedback of conference to colleagues", "Sharing insights with Superiors", "Information dissemination in institutes", "Create awareness in institution") have already been implemented by a major part of the respondents (between 77% and 82,5%). An overview of the results is presented in Figure 3.

A large part of the respondents considers the creation of awareness as the most important follow-up activity of the conference, followed by the need to include the topic of psycho-spiritual counselling into formation. Some respondents mention plans to construct counselling centers in their home regions.

"Creating awareness beyond especially in my religious community and introduce the topic in formation." "I raised the topic at the subregional Conference of Malawi, Zambia and Zimbabwe. The three countries agreed to establish a common psycho-spiritual counselling center."

"Information dissemination and facilitate training opportunities for others. My own training will come at the end of my leadership term."



2.5. Supportive and hindering factors

Supportive factors

Between 57,5% and 82,5% of the respondents assessed each of the listed factors as quite to very supportive (see graphics 7). The listed factors consist of the following:

- Openness to understand psychological needs of church personnel
- Interest in counselling as potential solution
- Interest in broader psycho-spiritual issues
- Openness to use counselling for personal development
- Motivation to engage and support counselling training or services for church personnel
- Motivation to engage and support counselling training or services for other people

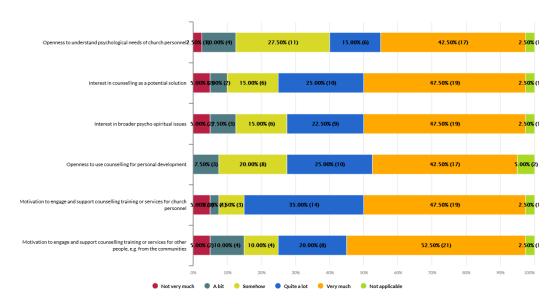


Figure 4: In your institution/workspace, to what extend do you perceive the following components as supportive factors?

However, for all factors, beside "openness to use counselling for personal development", there were also respondents who do not consider them as supportive (between 2,5% and 5% for each). Hence, all respondents perceive the openness to use counselling for personal development as at least a rather supportive factor. Nonetheless 10% of the respondents say that the motivation to engage and support counselling training for both church personnel and community members are not perceived as supportive factor (5% each). In this context motivation appeals to the pastoral environment. Between 7,5% and 10% of the respondents consider each factor listed above as a bit supportive. Nonetheless, most of the respondents perceives the factors as supportive (see above). The results of the corresponding survey question are presented in Figure 4.

A growing appreciation of the environment concerning the topic of psycho-spiritual counselling and the great potential to promote the topic either in formation or through other channels, as e.g. through media, are further perceived as supportive factors by the respondents. Those, reporting already implemented counselling structures refer to external psychologists as counsellors rather than themselves.

"Openness among members at workplace and in the community to share some areas of vulnerability and how to encounter with a counsellor is of great importance." "We have started counselling to the local communities and to others. We even use media."

"We have two psychologists in the Congregation and they have been giving counselling sessions and therapy already, who have brought awareness and learning."

Hindering factors

75% assess the lack of financial resources as a great hindering factor. 12,5% perceive the lack of interest by superiors as a great hindering factor; 30% say this is somehow hindering. It is argued that especially Bishops, but also pastoral students show little to no interest in the topic. According to the respondents, there is a lack of commitment by superiors. Percentagewise, a similar picture is drawn for the factors "Lack of time" and "Lack of interest by colleagues".

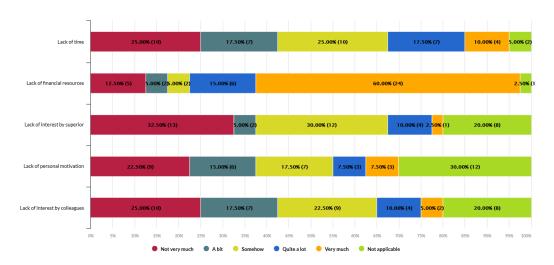


Figure 5: To what extend do you perceive the following components as hindering factors to engage in follow-up activities?

30% answered "not applicable" for lacking personal motivation. A possible explanation might be that it is less the self-motivation playing a major role in the implementation of psycho-spiritual counselling structures, but the urgent necessity. Thus, some respondents might not have been attending the conference out of self-motivation but out of their professional mission. All quantitative results are presented in Figure 5.

On top of that, the respondents mention that trained staff is lacking. Often, pastoral staff has to take over these roles, but without any experience. Further, time is lacking for them to responsibly fulfil these tasks.

"As religious and missionary sisters, we are running quite a number of activities and counselling is seen by the institution as an important area but the number of personnel that can be committed to study and practice is limited."

"I have too many responsibilities inside and outside my religious institute, so it is difficult to take over engagements." "Even though it is very clear to us that we need to move forward in our integration of the psycho-spiritual counselling [...], the fact that we have not invested in trained professionals keeps us at the level of wishful thinking. The cost of engaging professionals outside our establishment is beyond us."

Concerning the question about how the Covid-19 pandemic affected the implementation of follow-up activities, the majority of the respondents argues that especially the lockdown measures, as well as the urgent need to assist in emergency measures are hindering in implementing the before-mentioned follow-up activities. Particularly the lockdown measures and the resulting closures of organizations/institutes are perceived as great problems by the respondents.

3. Recommendations from the respondents

3.1. Strengthening of counselling in church context

Mostly, the respondents mention the importance to train psycho-spiritual counsellors. Furthermore, to strengthen counselling within the pastoral context, an improvement in the commitment of Bishops/ Superiors towards follow-up measures is urgently needed.

"The training of more psychologists in the Church so that we create a pool of therapists for support and networking in the area of counselling and therapy as the few are over-streched."

"Bringing awareness to the leaders of Institutes so that they engage their members to value counsiling and therapy." "Bishops need to understand and appreciate the importance of counselling in order to motivate lower structures."

"There is the need for a step-down workshop on psycho-spiritual counselling to create wider awareness among Church authorities." "My recommendation is to have a session of counselling organized for pastoral and Church agents at least once a year, either on diocesan or national level."

"There is the need basically of helping our leaders to acknowledge their own vulnerability so that they can appreciate the usefulness of counselling."

In the following, further points of recommendation are presented to which several participants appealed, but less frequently as the ones mentioned above:

- Continuing of support
- Implementation of specific funds/ provision of funding



- Improvement of sensibilization of priests and members of community (families, etc.)
- Development& implementation of programs

3.2. Recommendations to mission

According to the respondents, missio should organize follow-up sessions to the conference in Kenya, 2019, potentially also in several countries to strengthen the awareness about psycho-spiritual counselling even stronger. This is based on the argumentation that follow-up sessions in different countries would reach more people and would further reduce travel costs for participants. The idea of follow-up sessions is going in line with the recommendation that missio needs to strengthen the awareness of people concerning the issue of psycho-spiritual counselling.

Further mentioned aspects are the provision of financial resources as well as a support offered by missio for trainings in psycho-spiritual counselling.

"Develop a model for psychospiritual counselling that can be contextualized – create a hub of professionals that can offer assistance to Conference – Having periodic interaction with participants in order to encourage action at the local level." "If possible, running workshops on psycho-spiritual counselling like the one in Nairobi [...] at country level, so that we generate interest in religion and engage more religious at lower costs." "I do recommend to missio to provide both, financial and human resources, for the organization of counselling. Knowing the importance of this, missio should invite the Bishops Conference to apply for such assistance."

"Counselling for church employees is necessary. Therefore, missio should engage National Episcopal Conferences on this issue." "missio is a largely pastoral oriented Church Organization, hence the accompaniment and follow-up by missio is very important." "To offer educative conferences even online to empower a number of lay people, priests and religious with the knowledge. Missio [should] also give scholarships for counsellors who want to [follow] their studies in psycho-spiritual issues, either master of PhD."

"To continue supporting the Church not only financially but by providing avenues for counselling and also offering training on counselling to priests, sisters and brothers" "missio should help the Conference of Bishops that plan to establish centers for the training of personnel for psycho-spiritual counselling in their countries." "To follow-up on Bishop Conferences and Church organizations to find out what they are doing to put up structures and train personnel in order to offer psycho-spiritual help for religious priests."

Further aspects that were mentioned by the participants:

- Support in structure building
- Support in human resources (provision or get together)
- Provision of scholarships for staff to be trained
- Support in sensitizing superiors
- Provision of expertise



4. Conclusion

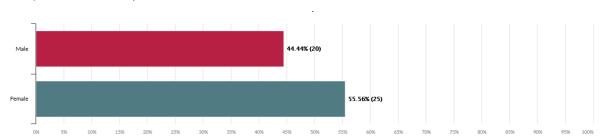
Overall, the survey draws a positive picture concerning the follow-up activities, the acknowledgement of the topic's importance as well as the wish to intensify the knowledge on psycho-spiritual counselling. Important hindering factors that appear are a lacking appreciation of the topic by superiors, as well as lacking trained pastoral staff to take over psycho-spiritual counselling activities. These struggles are recommended to be tackled, also by missio. Trainings in counselling are recommended and required, as well as the wish to integrate psycho-spiritual counselling into formation processes. missio is asked to organize follow-up sessions of the conference on a national level to better reach out for more people. Moreover, they are asked for support, not only financially but also through knowledge, human resources and its influence as Pontifical Missionary Organization on the Bishops and Superiors to make them aware of the urgent need for psycho-spiritual counselling.



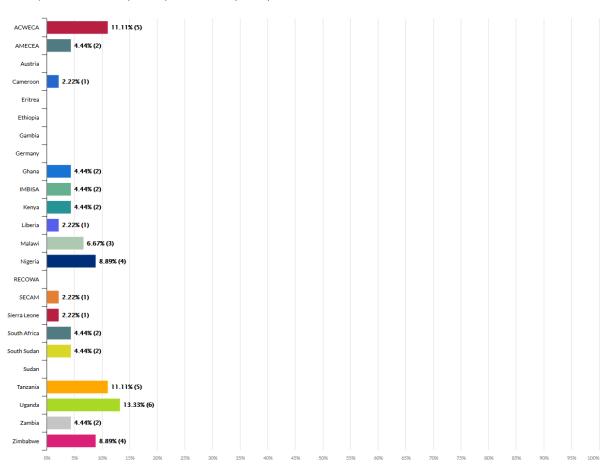

1) Which sex do you have?

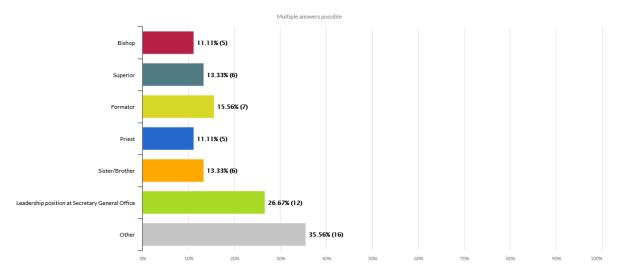


2) From which participant country are you from?





3) Currently, in which position are you in?



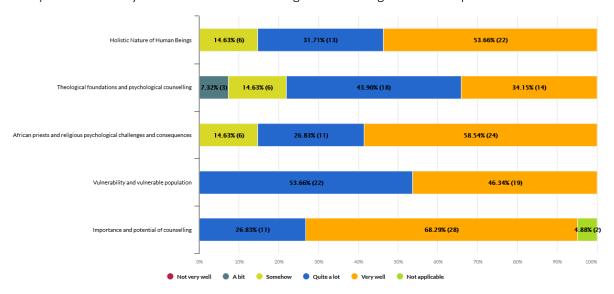

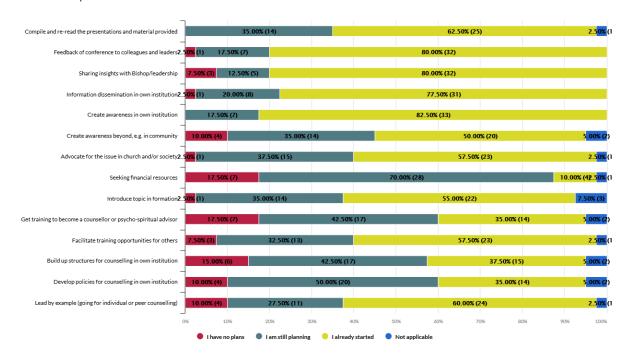

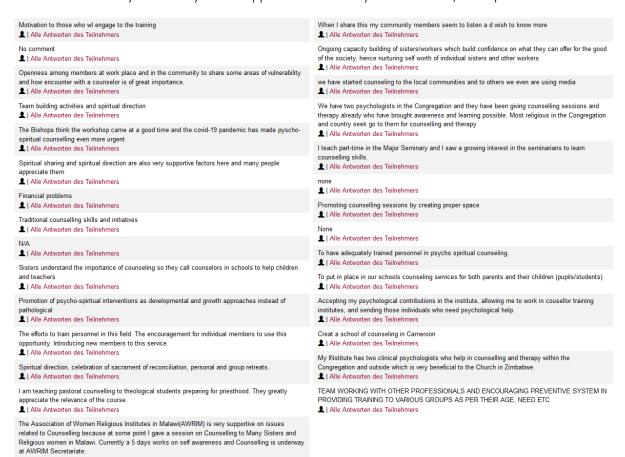

7) In your institution/workspace, to what extend do you perceive the following components as supportive factors?

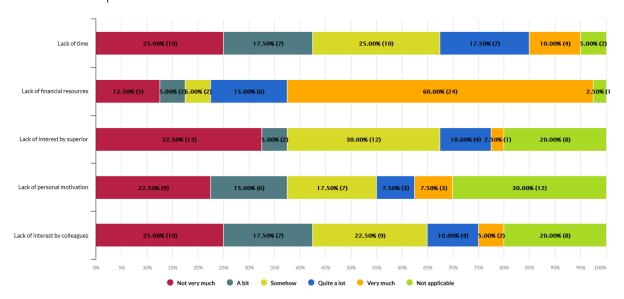


a. Do you find any other supportive factors in your institution/workspace?

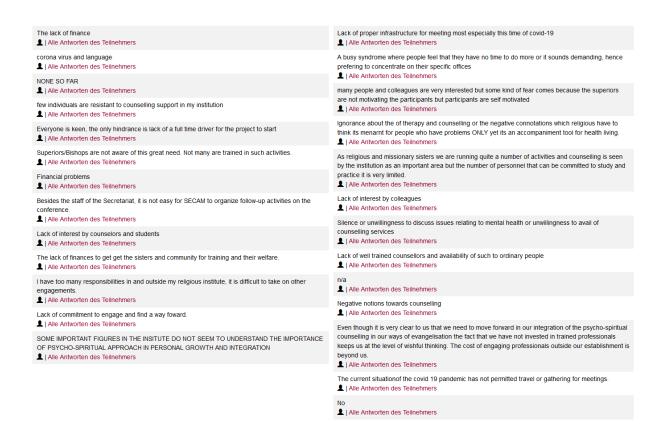




8) To what extend do you perceive the following components as hindering factors to engage in follow-up activities?

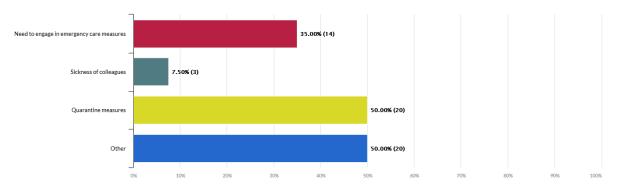


a. Do you find any other hindering factors in your institution/work space?
